


Trends in Admissions and Enrollment








Graduation Rates





Colloquium Pass Rates

Giving Back to the Community Community Activities

In the fall of 2023, senior nursing students participated and organized the activities of the community course focused on health promotion, restoration, and rehabilitation for underprivileged populations. Key activities included home visits in Bourj Hammoud, where students assessed health and made referrals, conducted blood pressure and diabetes screenings at BEEMART supermarket, and held educational sessions at local health centers and schools on topics like breastfeeding, nutrition, and hygiene. Students also organized health awareness events at the LAU Beirut and Byblos campuses. They also led the health awareness activity in collaboration with the Ghazir Municipality and LAUMC-RH mobile clinic. Their efforts in early screening and health awareness helped in improving community well-being.













Mental Health Fairs

The senior nursing students hosted two mental health fairs at the International School and Collège des Filles de la Charité and Dar Em-Nour in northern Lebanon. The fairs purpose was to raise awareness about depression, anxiety, suicide, and substance abuse. The nursing students developed posters, educational games, and flyers to engage students, reaching more than 400 students in grades 9 to 12 with information on these important mental health topics.



Community Health Fairs

The senior students also organized two health fairs. The first one was conducted in collaboration with the Byblos Municipality. During this fair, students raised awareness about healthy lifestyles, breast cancer, diabetes, hypertension, bullying, burn management, and colorectal cancer. The SAID NGO provided free FIT test screening vouchers and support for the event, which was very well attended by the public.



The second health fair was held at the Byblos National School in partnership with Al Salamah Al Ahli Primary Healthcare Center and the SAID NGO.

Senior nursing students hosted and participated in a seminar with SAID NGO on raising awareness about colorectal cancer (CRC) and its early detection. The LAU Nursing Club then shared that CRC is preventable, treatable, and beatable with the LAU community, offering students knowledge practical contributing to public health awareness.

National Organization for Organ and Tissue Donation and Transplantation (NOD-LB) Workshop

On Saturday, October 07, 2023, ARSCON collaborated with the National Organization for Organ and Tissue Donation and Transplantation (NOD-LB) to conduct a workshop for senior nursing students at LAU. The workshop covered the significance of organ donation, the nurse's role, family communication about donation, eligibility criteria, and ethical issues.

On January 30, 2024, The Nursing Club organized a welcoming meet-and-greet event at the start of the Spring 2024 semester. This event was designed to foster a sense of community, offer guidance, and academic emotional wellsupport being, ensuring a smooth and supportive integration into campus life.

On April 22, 2024, the Nursing Club, in collaboration with the Children Cancer Center of Lebanon, organized an event to raise awareness about HPV and its connection to cervical cancer. The event focused on the importance of vaccination, early detection, and prevention. Representatives from the center also discussed their fundraising efforts, inspiring nursing students with their dedication to supporting children with cancer.






Recognition and Pinning Ceremony "Strive, Evolve, Serve, and Excel!"
