What do I need to know about the program before I apply?

- You must meet all of the general university admission requirements, which include the SAT I.
- If you have earned the Baccalaureate II (or equivalent) you can be admitted as a sophomore.
- If you are admitted to LAU as a freshman you can select nursing as a major after completing the freshman requirements.
- If you begin your studies in Fall semester you can complete the 103-credit program of study in three years, including summer terms.
- You can enroll for the first semester at either campus Beirut or Byblos.
 Starting with the spring semester of the sophomore year nursing students enroll on the Byblos campus.

What are the career opportunities for nurses?

- There is a shortage of professional registered nurses (RN) in Lebanon and worldwide.
- Graduates of LAU's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.) program will take
 the National Examination offered by the Lebanese Ministry of Higher Education
 (colloquium) to be licensed as an RN. They can also apply to take RN licensure
 examinations in other countries.
- Graduates with a B.S.N. can seek employment as registered nurses in any clinical setting. Many nurses who earn a B.S.N. move into management and leadership positions in health care.
- B.S.N. graduates can attend graduate school to earn master's and doctorate degrees in nursing, public health, health administration and other related fields.
- Nurses with graduate degrees can become faculty members at nursing schools.

Why study at LAU?
